Louis Armstrong was a Jazz musician. He was famous for being a fantastic trumpet player and for inventing the art of scat, or a way of singing that sounds like a bunch of random sounds. Because of the changes that Louis Armstrong helped to bring, Jazz music became more popular. This type of music also helped to change the way people danced, especially women.

Henry Ford was improved the **assembly line**, which **increased** the number of cars that could be produced each year. He is also known for his company, The **Ford Motor Company**. Because of the boost in the production of cars, cars became **cheaper**; therefore, more people could buy them. This also changed the way people **traveled**.
