1.) Explain what rights are protected by the 15th and 19th amendments. Why were these amendments important?

The 15^{th} Amendment protects all men's right to vote, regardless of race. The 19^{th} Amendment protects women's right to vote. These are both important because they gave new rights to groups who had never before had the right to vote.

The founding fathers created a way for the Constitution to be changed, this is called the
 Amendment
 process. Below, list the steps in the amendment process to our Constitution.

1^{st:} The idea must be proposed by two thirds of the states or by two thirds of the House AND Senate

2nd It must then be ratified (made law) by three fourths of the State Legislatures or by three fourths of the states at state conventions.

3.) The 5th amendment protects a citizen's right for "due process." What does the right of due process mean?

Due process means everyone gets fair treatment under the law.
